

Although the words that we brought last week from the *Ramchal* seem unbelievable, I would like to bring another two primary sources that seem to confirm it.

The Gemara (Menachos 29b) states:

"Rav Yehuda Nesia asked Rav Ami: What is the meaning of that which is written: 'Trust in the Lord forever, for in the Lord, is an everlasting [olamim] Rock (Yeshayah 26:4)?' Rav Ami said to him: Anyone who puts their trust in the Holy One, blessed be He, will have Him as his refuge in this world and in the World-to-Come. This is alluded to in the word 'olamim,' which can also mean: Worlds."

Additionally, one may ask on the *Ramchal*: Doesn't the *pasuk* in *Tehillim* (31:20) state regarding the World-to-Come: "How great is Your goodness that You have stored away for those who fear You..." Doesn't that imply that *Olam Haba* is only for those who fear Heaven?

However, one who reads the rest of the *pasuk* will see that in fact it confirms the words of the Ramchal as it states: *How great is Your goodness that You have stored away for those who fear You,* **that You have worked for those who take refuge in You!** 

Even if you struggle when it comes to having fear of Heaven, nevertheless you should strengthen yourself to trust in Hashem, for as we quoted above: *Anyone who puts their trust in the Holy One, blessed be He, will have Him as his refuge in this world and in the World-to-Come.*
